

Carnegie Center Use As A Training/Meeting Center

The Carnegie Center has been completely revamped for more effective and efficient use as training and meeting facility. During the last six months of the fiscal year (Jan – June), 138 training/meetings have taken place with 9,791 persons attending. A Carnegie brochure has been updated and will be used to continue to market the facility.

The building is equipped with high-speed Internet access, one built-in screen in the auditorium, and one large mobile screen. A portable sound system and LCD projector are also available. We also offer a wireless computer lab with twenty laptop computers. These may be used in any of the meeting spaces in the building. Today, the Carnegie Center is a multi-service center that serves workers and residents in downtown Phoenix and the eastern Capitol Mall. It offers:

- Reference for the State Library's genealogy, archives, legal, and general reference collections
- Bonus Years @ The Carnegie is a series of programs addressing the issues of interest to active older adults, such as healthy aging, lifelong learning, re-careering and civic engagement. The series provided current information on productive aging and fosters discussions about the personal and societal impacts of an aging population.
- The Arizona Women's Hall of Fame, recognizing the diverse women who have helped shape the state's history
- The Arizona Center for the Book, an affiliate of the Center for the Book at the Library of Congress, whose goal is to carry the Center for the Book's mission of "stimulating public interest in books, reading, literacy, and libraries to the state and local level."
