About the Arizona State Library, Archives and Public Records

The Arizona State Library, Archives and Public Records provides services to Arizona residents through six branches:

- Arizona Capitol Museum celebrates Arizona's vibrant cultural heritage through history.
- Archives and Records Management collects, preserves and makes available permanent public records, historical manuscripts, photographs and other materials that contribute to the understanding of Arizona history; also administers the management of public records throughout state and local government in Arizona.
- Arizona Talking Book Library provides books, magazines and other library resources in alternate formats for all Arizona residents whose visual or physical disabilities prevent the reading of conventional print materials.
- Digital Arizona Library provides digital and print resources for learners and readers, including Arizona Memory Project, Reading Arizona, Arizona Collection, Arizona maps and newspapers.
- State Library of Arizona serves the informational needs of state government and the public; also provides resource sharing services to Arizona libraries.
- Library Development empowers Arizona libraries to offer excellent customer service through consulting, grant funding, resources and training.

One of the resources provided by Library Development is the annual collection of Arizona Public Library Statistics gathered from the public and tribal libraries of the state. The goal is that this data with a brief analysis and summary will assist libraries to:

- Analyze community needs
- Plan services
- Use data to inform budgets and grant applications
- Track their data over time
- Compare their data to that from other libraries serving similar populations.

Arizona Public Libraries: Looking at the Numbers (2015)



44.2 MILLION

Libraries in Arizona saw a lot of use in 2015 with customers checking out a combined 44.2 million books, DVD's, and music CD's. That works out to almost 7 items for each person in the state.





Observations and Trends

From the 2014-15 Arizona Public Library Data Survey

Arizona's public and tribal libraries provide valuable community resources across the state. In 2014-15, they had a collective 26 million visitors – on average, half a million patrons walk through the doors every week. More than three million Arizonans have library cards. Library users borrowed 44 million items, and showed up 1.5 million times for programs. Arizona's libraries are busy places – and they do all of this work for about \$25 per Arizonan. This report documents the significant service that libraries provide in their communities, and it also shows changes to Arizonans' library habits. Program audiences are continuing to grow, although the number of programs is down slightly. Electronic resources are expanding, and for the first time, the growth in reported electronic circulation has offset the decline in physical circulation. At the same time, libraries are still struggling to recover from a decline in revenue that began in the late 2000s. While 2014-15 saw a slight increase in per capita revenue, expenditures continued to decline. As a result of that decline, visitation continues to decline and staffing remains flat.

This report includes information on 91 public and tribal libraries, which operate a total of 222 library buildings and 11 bookmobiles. The number of library buildings increased by one, with the addition of Buckeye Public Library's Coyote Branch. Almost every municipality in Arizona has a public library, as do many unincorporated areas. While most of the libraries included in this report operate as governmental or tribal entities, the report includes non-profit libraries that serve the general public. Some tribal libraries choose not to share information for this report.

Budget

This year saw revenues outpace expenditures, correcting last year's numbers which had expenditures exceeding revenues for the first time in recent history. Revenue increased by almost 7 percent, while expenditures increased just .15 of one percent. About 94 percent of operating revenue comes from local or county government. Revenue was up for the libraries serving Phoenix, Maricopa County, Pima County, Flagstaff/Coconino County, Scottsdale and Yuma County. Revenues were down for libraries in Mesa, Glendale, Chandler, Mohave County and Peoria. While capital revenue dropped slightly, capital expenditures almost doubled from \$3.1 million to \$6 million. On a positive note, both capital expenditures and revenue increased about 32 percent. More than 95 percent of capital revenue is from local government.

Staffing

Libraries reported a slight increase in full-time equivalent staff positions over the previous year. The total number of staff increased from 2,018 to 2,029, an increase of about 11 positions – about one half of 1 percent. Librarians make up 27 percent of Arizona's public and tribal library staff members, and 82 percent of those with the title librarian have a graduate degree from an American Library Association accredited program.

Collections

Libraries reported declines in all areas of physical holdings. For this year, the libraries recorded 9.7 million physical holdings: 8.1 million books/print materials, 630,000 audios, and 1 million videos.

Each library is asked to report its circulating e-book, e-audio and e-video collection based on the number of units available to circulate. Because many libraries participate in consortia e-content groups, many of the numbers are duplicative, and cannot simply be added together. When eliminating duplicative consortia numbers, Arizona's public and tribal libraries collectively have about 400,000 e-book units. There are 32 libraries that report they do not have e-books or e-audible; not surprisingly, they are mostly the smallest.

Service Measures

Arizona's libraries saw a continuing drop in library visitation with per capita visits declining from 4.13 to 3.9 from 2014 to 2015. This continues a trend of visitation increasing until 2009 in the U.S., and 2010 in Arizona, and then beginning to drop.¹

Combined physical and electronic circulation increased by about 1 percent this year, marking the first year that a decline in physical circulation has been offset by an increase in e-circulation. Electronic circulation jumped by more than 33 percent, from 3.3 million to 4.4 million. Physical circulation declined about 1.5 percent, from 40.4 million to 39.8 million. Children's materials make up about 36 percent of circulation.

E-circulation accounted for about 10 percent of total circulation. These numbers only include those electronic materials that must be downloaded, and then returned. They do not reflect database usage where materials are either used online, or may be downloaded for permanent use.

The number of public computers held steady, while the usage of those computers saw significant declines. In 2015, there were 896 computer sessions for every thousand Arizonans, compared with 1,157 sessions per thousand the previous year. Libraries reported they had 5,589 computers this past year, compared with 5,573 the prior year. Libraries recorded 5.3 million wireless sessions, in addition to the 6 million total public access computer sessions.

Programs

Attendance at programming continues to grow at Arizona's public and tribal libraries. The number of programs being offered was down slightly, from 73,511 to 72,083, while attendance was up slightly from 1.4 million to 1.5 million. Almost two-third of people attended children's programming.

Cautions and Considerations

For the purposes of this report, we calculate both "core population" and the population of the "legal service area." The "core population" excludes municipalities that may be within a county library district, but operate their own libraries, and reservation populations if the library district has no branches on the reservation. We used the "core population" to calculate per capita numbers for individual libraries, so some of these are significantly different from the previous year. This especially impacted the county library districts where there are large reservations or municipal libraries (Apache, Navajo, Maricopa, and Yavapai). Statewide per capita numbers are calculated using the total state population.

The Institute of Museums and Library Services is expected to release a national report on FY2015 in 2017. The information presented in this report, and the information presented in that future report, may have some minor differences. If a participating library indicates that they provide a service/collection, but don't have the information to respond to the data, IMLS imputes that data at the unit level. The imputed number is included in statewide totals and per capita number. For the purposes of this report, no imputed data has been included. If a library did not provide a response to a measure, a zero was calculated into the state total – which decreases the statewide total and creates a lower per capita number.

Historic Background and Finding Previous Data Sets

The Arizona State Library has been collecting public library statistics since at least 1966. The State Library joined with other state libraries in the U.S. beginning in 1989 to collect data at the national level. The national survey was administered by the National Center for Education Statistics, with the partnership of the National Commission on Libraries and Information Science, through 2007, and by the Institute of Museum and Library Services since then.

The survey includes both questions required by the federal survey, and Arizona-only questions that help Arizonans better understand how their libraries serve their communities.





Arizona Public Libraries Five-Year Trends FY 2011-2015


CIRCULATION, VISITATION, and PHYSICAL COLLECTIONS PER CAPITA




OPERATING REVENUE and EXPENDITURE PER CAPITA

The Arizona State Library, Archives and Public Records participates in a national public library data collection system known as the Public Library Data Survey. The purpose of this system is to ensure the collection of comparable data in all states. The data is used for planning, research, evaluation, and policymaking decisions by federal, state, and local officials, professional associates, researchers, educators, local practitioners, and other interested users.

Please complete one report for your library or library system. The first nine sections ask administrative entity (single-entity library or library system) questions about legal structure, staffing, revenue, expenditures, electronic access. Then, section 10 asks for outlet (building or bookmobile) information on library materials and services. County Librarians: please complete a report for the library district office.

Definitions are important to ensure comparability of data from different libraries and states. For the most part, these definitions have been agreed to on a national basis. It is critical that you read and respond according to the definitions.

Reporting libraries should not leave any items blank. You should enter "0" if the appropriate entry for an item is zero or "none." Enter zero if you do not have this item, or do not spend money on this budgeted item. If you do not know the answer, or do not collect this data, check -1 (negative one). Educated estimates are important if exact data is not available. Indicate that your figure is an estimate by entering a federal note.

Items that ask for dollar amounts must be rounded to the nearest whole dollar. However, items such as FTE staff and hours of service may be reported with up to two decimal places.

An * indicates that the question is part of the national survey, and the data is reported to the Institute of Museum and Library Services for inclusion in the national data set. Questions without an * are Arizona-only.

SECTION 1: IDENTIFICATION

1.01 FSCS ID (IMLS Assigned)*

This is a pre-assigned number by IMLS. This should be automatically filled in your report.

1.02 LIB ID (State Assigned)*

This is a pre-assigned identifier by the State Library. This should be automatically filled in your report.

1.03 Library Name*

This is the legal name of the administrative entity.

Note: Provide the name of the public library. Do not use acronyms. Do not abbreviate the name unless it exceeds the WebPLUS field length of 60 characters. Avoid abbreviations at the beginning of the name and do not punctuate abbreviations.

1.04 Street Address*

This is the complete street address of the administrative entity.

Note: Do not report a post office box or general delivery.

1.05 City (of street address)*

This is the city or town in which the administrative entity is located.

1.06 ZIP Code (of street address)*

This is the standard five-digit postal ZIP code for the street address of the administrative entity.

1.07 Mailing Address*

This is the mailing address of the administrative entity.

1.08 City (of mailing address)*

This is the city or town of the mailing address for the administrative entity.

1.09 ZIP Code (of mailing address)*

This is the standard five-digit postal ZIP code for the mailing address of the administrative entity.

1.10 County*

This is the county in which the headquarters of the administrative entity is physically located.

SECTION 2: CONTACT INFORMATION

2.01 Main Library Number*

This is the telephone number of the administrative entity, including area code.

Note: Report telephone number without spacing or punctuation. If the Administrative Entity has no phone, please check “-3” (for Not Applicable).

2.02 Extension

This is the extension for the main library number, if needed.

2.03 Web Address

This is the URL for the Administrative Entity’s homepage.

2.04 Name of Library Director/Manager

This is the name for the current library director or manager.

2.05 Email Address

This is the email address for the current library director or manager.

2.06 Name of Person Completing this Report

This is the person filling out the public library statistics online report.

2.07 Direct Phone

This is the phone number for the person filling out the online report.

2.08 Extension

This is the extension for the above mentioned phone number, if needed.

2.09 Email Address

This is the email address for the person filling out the online report.

SECTION 3: CLASSIFICATION AND STRUCTURE

3.01 Interlibrary Relationship Code*

Select one of the following:

- HQ – Headquarters of a Federation or Cooperative. The library or entity that provides the physical space and staff who manage, coordinate, or administer the programs of the federation or cooperative.
Note: Agencies that serve other libraries rather than the public should not be reported to FSCS.
- ME – Member of a Federation or Cooperative. An autonomous library joined by formal or informal agreement(s) with (a) other autonomous libraries in the same state to perform various services cooperatively, such as resource sharing, communications, etc., and (b) libraries that are part of national, multi-state or statewide library federations or cooperatives. (Do not include OCLC.) Do not include multiple-outlet administrative entities (e.g., libraries with branches and that have the word “system” in their legal name) if the entity does not have an agreement with another autonomous library.
- NO – Not a member of a Federation or Cooperative.

3.02 Legal Basis Code*

The legal basis is the type of local government structure within which the entity functions. It reflects the state or local law, which authorizes the library. Select one of the following:

- CC – City/County. A multi-jurisdictional entity that is operated jointly by a county and a city.
- CI – Municipal Government (city, town or village). A municipal government is an organized local government authorized in a state’s constitution and statutes and established to provide general government for a specific concentration of population in a defined area.
- CO – County/Parish. An organized local government authorized in a state’s constitution and statutes and established to provide general government.
- LD – Library District. A library district is a local entity other than a county, municipality, township, or school district that is authorized by state law to establish and operate a public library as defined by FSCS. It has sufficient administrative and fiscal autonomy to qualify as a separate government. Fiscal autonomy requires support from local taxation dedicated to library purposes (e.g., a library tax).
- MJ – Multi-jurisdictional. An entity operated jointly by two or more units of local government under an intergovernmental agreement which a jointly appointed board or similar means of joint governance; to be distinguished from a library which contracts to serve other jurisdictions and from special library districts. Note: Please put city/county combinations under ‘CC’, rather than under Multi-jurisdictional.
- NL – Native American Tribal Government. An organized local government authorized and established to provide general government to residents of a Native American reservation.
- NP – Non-profit Association or Agency. An entity privately controlled but meeting the statutory definition of a public library in a given state; includes association libraries and libraries with 501(c) designation.
- SD – School District. An organized local entity providing public elementary, secondary, and/or higher education which, under state law, has sufficient administrative and fiscal autonomy to qualify as a separate government. Excludes “dependent public school systems” of county, municipal, township, or state governments.
- OT – Other.

3.03 Administrative Structure Code*

This code identifies an autonomous library entity (administrative entity) that has its own governance and funding.

An administrative entity is the agency that is legally established under local or state law to provide public library service to the population of a local jurisdiction. The administrative entity may have a single outlet, or it may have more than one outlet.

Select one of the following:

- MA – Administrative Entity with Multiple Direct Service Outlets where Administrative Offices are Separate. An administrative entity that serves the public directly with two or more service outlets, including some combination of one central library, branch(es), bookmobile(s), and/or books-by-mail only. The administrative offices are separate from the direct service outlets and do not provide direct library services.
- MO – Administrative Entity with Multiple Direct Service Outlets where Administrative Offices are Not Separate. An administrative entity that serves the public directly with two or more service outlets, including some combination of one central library, branch(es), bookmobile(s), and/or books-by-mail only.
- SO – Administrative Entity with a Single Direct Service Outlet. An administrative entity that serves the public directly with one central library, books-by-mail only, or one bookmobile.

3.04 FSCS Public Library Definition*

Answer <Y>es or <N>o to the following question: “Does this public library meet all the criteria of the FSCS public library definition?”

A public library is an entity that is established under state enabling laws or regulations to serve a community, district, or region, and that provides at least the following:

- ✓ An organized collection of printed or other library materials, or a combination thereof;
- ✓ Paid staff;
- ✓ An established schedule in which services of the staff are available to the public;
- ✓ The facilities necessary to support such a collection, staff, and schedule; and
- ✓ Is supported in whole or in part with public funds.

Note: If the library meets all of the requirements of this definition, respond with a <Y>es. If the library does not meet one or more of the requirements, respond with a <N>o.

3.05 Geographic Code (State Supplied)*

The State Library selects the geographic code from among the following Census supplied options:

- CI1 – Municipal Government (city, town or village) (exactly)
- CI2 – Municipal Government (city, town or village) (most nearly)
- CO1 – County/Parish (exactly)
- CO2 – County/Parish (most nearly)
- MA1 – Metropolitan Area (exactly)
- MA2 – Metropolitan Area (most nearly)
- MC1 – Multi-County (exactly)
- MC2 – Multi-County (most nearly)
- SD1 – School District (exactly)
- SD2 – School District (most nearly)
- OTH – Other

3.06 Legal Service Area Boundary Change*

Answer <Y>es or <N>o to the following question: “Did the administrative entity’s legal service area boundaries change since last year?”

Note: Changes are likely to result, for example, when a municipality annexes land, when one municipality in a county becomes either an independent city or its own county necessitating its exclusion from the first county’s geography, or when an administrative entity contracts to provide public library service for some additional geographic area other than the geographic area for which it was established (e.g., a municipal library contracts to serve county residents).

3.07 Population of the Legal Service Area (State Supplied)*

The number of people in the geographic area for which a public library has been established to offer services and from which (or on behalf of which) the library derives revenue, plus any areas served under contract for which the library is the primary service provider.

Note: The determination of this population figure is the responsibility of the state library agency.

3.08 Number of Central Libraries*

This is one type of single outlet library (SO) or the library, which is the operational center of a multiple-outlet library (MO or MA). Usually all processing is centralized here and the principal collections are housed here. This is synonymous with main library.

Note: Each administrative entity may report either no central library or one central library. No administrative entity may report more than one central library. In the administrative entity file, this simply means reporting “0” or “1” for central library. Where two or more libraries are considered “centrals” for state or local purposes, one central library and one or more branch libraries should be reported to FSCS. If you wish to identify a central library in the outlet file, identify the library with the largest collection as the central library for FSCS purposes, and report all others as branches. Where there are several co-equal outlets and no principal collection, report all such outlets as branches, not central libraries.

3.09 Number of Branch Libraries*

A branch library is an auxiliary unit of an administrative entity which has at least all of the following:

- ✓ Separate quarters;
- ✓ An organized collection of library materials;
- ✓ Paid staff; and
- ✓ Regularly scheduled hours for being open to the public.

3.10 Number of Bookmobiles*

A bookmobile is a traveling branch library. It consists of at least all of the following:

- ✓ A truck or van that carries an organized collection of library materials;
- ✓ Paid staff; and
- ✓ Regularly scheduled hours (bookmobile stops) for being open to the public.

SECTION 4: LIBRARY INFORMATION

Report figures as of the last day of the fiscal year.

4.01 Number of Registered Users (All Ages)*

A registered user is a library user who has applied for and received an identification number or card from the public library that has established conditions under which the user may borrow library materials or gain access to other library resources.

Note: Files should have been purged within the last three (3) years.

4.02 Number of Registered Users (0-11)

A registered user is a library user who has applied for and received an identification number or card from the public library, which establishes the conditions under which the user may borrow materials. Figures are not reported unless the library has purged its file at least once within the last three years.

4.03 Number of Interlibrary Loans Provided by your Library*

These are library materials, or copies of the materials, provided by one autonomous library to another upon request. The libraries involved in interlibrary loans are not under the same library administration. These data are reported as annual figures.

4.04 Number of Interlibrary Loans Received by your Library*

These are library materials, or copies of the materials, received by one autonomous library from another upon request. The libraries involved in interlibrary loans are not under the same library administration. These data are reported as annual figures.

4.05 Is the library eligible to receive LSTA funds?

Please indicate whether your library is eligible to receive LSTA funds, regardless of whether your library applies for LSTA. Review the current LSTA policy, available at <http://www.azlibrary.gov/libdev/funding/lsta> . Indicate whether this library meets the LSTA criteria.

5.01 Access to Government Publications

Library staff members are familiar with both online and print government publications, at both the state and national level.

5.02 Access to Legal Materials for Public

The library has current, popular law-related materials. Staff members know how to help the public find print and online legal resources.

5.03 Arizona Memory Project

The library has digitized and submitted a collection to the Arizona Memory Project.

5.04 Community Engagement Programs

Staff members plan and carry out at least one program each year on current topics of importance to the community. These programs may include but are not limited to: hosting forums to explore community issues, creating opportunities for hackers to engage in community problem solving, or leading efforts to develop a broad and inclusive community vision.

5.05 Community Referral Materials

The library provides community members with compiled information on local community resources. The compilation may be in a notebook or other printed reference, or online.

5.06 E-Books

The library provides e-books that may be checked out and downloaded onto patrons’ devices.

5.07 Every Child Ready to Read

At least one current staff member has participated in Every Child Ready to Read training, and the library offers at least one workshop per year.

5.08 Early Literacy Programs (Other)

Staff members plan and carry out programs aimed at helping parents/caregivers/teachers of young children learn to share literacy activities with children ages 0-5. These may be national programs, such as Mother Goose, Family Place, or Brain Time or may be locally designed, such as a storytime that includes early literacy messages for adults.

5.09 Informational Literacy Programs

Staff members plans and carries out at least one informational literacy program each year. The program may target students or adults.

5.10 Interlibrary Loan

The library offers to acquire resources for patrons from another library within the guidelines of the State Resource Attainment Policy.

5.11 Job Assistance & Training

The library has books and/or online resources to help patrons find and prepare for jobs. The library offers job assistance training at least once a year.

5.12 ONEBOOKAZ

Staff members promote reading of the selected ONEBOOKAZ through displays and bookmarks. Staff members plan at least one activity such as a book discussion or special program around the book. Note: For 2013 only, the BIG READ selection was substituted and counts as participation in ONEBOOKAZ.

5.13 Online Job and Career Materials

The library's website provides one or more links to resources to help patrons find jobs and develop career skills.

5.14 Professional Development for Staff

The library offers at least one on-site professional development opportunity for staff each year.

5.15 Programming for Adults

Staff members plan and carryout at least one program each year aimed primarily at adults.

5.16 Services to Visually Impaired

The library offers large print books; refers patrons to the Braille and Talking Book Library; and provides devices to magnify text or convert it into speech.

5.17 Small Business Development

The library has books and/or online resources to help patrons learn about small business development. The library welcomes patrons to use the library as a temporary office.

5.18 Statewide Databases

The library provides a link to the statewide EBSCO databases, and promotes their use through staff referrals and/or marketing materials on an ongoing basis.

5.19 Strategic Planning

The library's management team has undertaken a strategic plan within the last three years.

5.20 Summer Reading Program

Staff members plan and carry out activities designed to promote reading during the summer.

SECTION 6: PAID STAFF

Report the total number of budgeted full-time equivalent positions for each category. To ensure comparable data, 40 hours per week has been set as the measure of full-time employment (FTE). To calculate this number, add the average number of hours worked by each person per week and divide by 40. For example, if you have three people who work 40 hours, 30 hours, and 19 hours, you would total these numbers (40 + 30 + 19) and divide by 40. You would report 2.25 FTEs.

6.03 FTE Positions of All Other Paid Staff*

This includes all other FTE employees paid from the reporting unit budget, including plant operations, security, and maintenance staff.

6.04 Total: FTE Positions of Paid Staff (Calculated)*

This is the calculated total of all paid staff including those with or without the title of librarian or a Master's Degree.

6.05 Salary – Entry Level Professional

Figure listed is the annual salary (not a salary range) for the reporting fiscal year.

6.06 Salary – Library Director/Manager

Figure listed is the annual salary (not a salary range) for the reporting fiscal year.

6.07 How many volunteers helped the library last year?

Please list the number of unique volunteers that helped your library last year.

6.08 How many hours in total did the volunteers work last year?

Please list the number of hours the volunteers listed above worked for your library last year.

SECTION 7: LIBRARY REVENUE

Report revenue used for operating expenditures as defined below. Include federal, state, local, or other grants. DO NOT include revenue for major capital expenditures, contributions to endowments, revenue passed through to another agency (e.g., fines), or funds unspent in the previous fiscal year (e.g., carryover). (Funds transferred from one public library to another public library should be reported by only one of the public libraries. The State Data Coordinator shall determine which library reports these funds: In Arizona, the funds should be reported by the entity using the funds to provide direct public service.)

7.01 Government Revenue – Local (City/Tribal)

Arizona Public Library Statistics

This includes all local government funds designated by the community, district, or region and available for expenditure by the public library. Do not include the value of any contributed or in-kind services or the value of any gifts and donations, library fines, fees, or grants.

Do not include state, federal, and other funds passed through local government for library use. Report these funds with state government revenue or federal government revenue, as appropriate.

7.02 Government Revenue – Local (County/District)

This includes all local government funds designated by the community, district, or region and available for expenditure by the public library. Do not include the value of any contributed or in-kind services or the value of any gifts and donations, library fines, fees, or grants.

Do not include state, federal, and other funds passed through local government for library use. Report these funds with state government revenue or federal government revenue, as appropriate.

7.03 Total: Government Revenue – Local (Calculated)*

This is the calculated value of all local government revenue.

7.04 Government Revenue – State (including State Grants-In-Aid)*

These are all funds distributed to public libraries by state government for expenditure by the public libraries, except for federal monies distributed by the state, such as LSCA/LSTA funds. Do NOT include SGIA CONSTRUCTION GRANTS. Report that money in Capital Revenue (State). This also includes funds from such sources as penal fines, license fees, and mineral rights.

Note: If operating revenue from consolidated taxes is the result of state legislation, the revenue should be reported under state revenue (even though the revenue may be from multiple sources).

7.05 Government Revenue – Federal (LSTA Funds)

All funds from LSTA distributed to public libraries for expenditure by the public libraries.

7.06 Government Revenue – Federal (Other)

All revenue from the federal government distributed to public libraries for expenditure by the public libraries, including federal money distributed by the state, except LSTA funds. Include E-rate reimbursements as income only if the funds go into the library's budget.

7.07 Source of Government Revenue – Federal (Other)

List the source of the federal government revenue.

7.08 Total: Government Revenue – Federal (Calculated)*

This is the calculated total of all federal government revenue.

7.09 Other Revenue*

This is all operating revenue other than that reported under local, state, and federal. Include, for example, monetary gifts and donations received in the current year, interest, library fines, fees for library services, or grants. Do not include the value of any contributed or in-kind services or the value of any non-monetary gifts and donations.

7.10 Total: Operating Revenue (Calculated)*

This is the calculated total of all operating revenue listed above.

CAPITAL REVENUE

Report all revenue to be used for major capital expenditures, by source of revenue. Include funds received for a) site acquisition; b) new buildings; c) additions to or renovation of library buildings; d) furnishings, equipment, and initial collections (print, non-print, and electronic) for new buildings, building additions, or building renovations; e) computer hardware and software used to support library operations, to link to networks, or to run information products; f) new vehicles; and g) other one-time major projects. Exclude revenue to be used for replacement and repair of existing furnishings and equipment, regular purchase of library materials, and investments for capital appreciation. Exclude contributions to endowments, income passed through to another agency (e.g., fines), or funds unspent in the previous fiscal year (e.g., carryover). Funds transferred from one public library to another public library should be reported by only one of the public libraries. Report federal, state, local, and other revenues to be used for major capital expenditures in the following categories:

7.11 Capital Revenue (Local)*

Report all governmental funds designed by the community, district, or region and available to the public library for the purpose of major capital expenditures, except for state and/or federal money distributed by the local government.

7.12 Capital Revenue (State)*

Report all funds distributed to public libraries by state government for expenditure by the public libraries for the purpose of major capital expenditures, except for federal money distributed by the state.

7.13 Capital Revenue (Federal)*

Report federal government funds, including federal funds distributed by the state or locality, and grants and aid received by the library for the purposes of major capital expenditures.

7.14 Capital Revenue (Other)*

Report private (non-governmental funds), including grants received by the library for the purpose of major capital expenditures.

7.15 Total: Capital Revenue (Calculated)*

This is the calculated total of all capital revenue listed above.

Note: The amounts reported for total capital revenue and total capital expenditures are not expected to be equal.

SECTION 8: LIBRARY EXPENDITURES

OPERATING EXPENDITURES

Operating expenditures are the current and recurrent costs necessary to support the provision of library services. Significant costs, especially benefits and salaries, that are paid by other taxing agencies (government agencies with the authority to levy taxes) "on behalf of" the library may be included if the information is available to the reporting agency. Only such funds that are supported by expenditure documents (such as invoices, contracts, payroll records, etc.) at the point of disbursement should be included. Do not report the value of free items as expenditures. Do not report estimated costs as expenditures. Do not report capital expenditures under this category.

8.01 Staff Expenditures (Salaries & Wages)*

This includes salaries and wages for all library staff (including plant operations, security, and maintenance staff) for the fiscal year. Include salaries and wages before deductions but exclude employee benefits.

8.02 Staff Expenditures (Employee Benefits)*

These are the benefits outside of salaries and wages paid and accruing to employees (including plant operations, security, and maintenance staff), regardless of whether the benefits or equivalent cash options are available to all employees. Include amounts for direct paid employee benefits including Social Security, retirement, medical insurance,

life insurance, guaranteed disability income protection, unemployment compensation, workman's compensation, tuition, and housing benefits.

8.03 Total: Staff Expenditures (Calculated)*

This is the calculated total of the above staff expenditures.

COLLECTION EXPENDITURES

This includes all operating expenditures from the library budget for all materials in print, microform, electronic, and other formats considered part of the collection, whether purchased, leased, or licensed. Exclude charges or fees for interlibrary loans and expenditures for document delivery.

8.04 Collection Expenditures (Print)*

Report all operating expenditures for the following print materials: books, serial back-files, current serial subscriptions, government documents, and any other print acquisitions.

8.05 Collection Expenditures (Other Physical)*

Report all operating expenditures for other materials, such as microform, audio and video physical units, DVD, and materials in new formats.

8.06 Collection Expenditures (Electronic – E-Book)

See the note below on operating expenditures for electronic (digital) materials.

8.07 Collection Expenditures (Electronic – Other Downloadables)

See the note below on operating expenditures for electronic (digital) materials.

8.08 Collection Expenditures (Electronic – Other)

See the note below on operating expenditures for electronic (digital) materials.

8.09 Total: Collection Expenditures (Electronic) (Calculated)*

This is the total of the above questions on electronic collection expenditures.

For questions 8.06 through 8.08 above report all operating expenditures for electronic (digital) materials. Types of electronic materials include e-books, audio and video downloadables, e-serials (including journals), government documents, databases (including locally mounted, full text or not), electronic files, reference tools, scores, maps, or pictures in electronic or digital format, including materials digitized by the library. Electronic materials can be distributed on magnetic tape, diskettes, computer software, CD-ROM, or other portable digital carrier, and can be accessed via a computer, via access to the internet, or by using an e-book reader. Include expenditures for materials held locally and for remote electronic materials for which permanent or temporary access rights have been acquired. Include expenditures for database licenses. [Note: Based on ISO 2789 definition.]

Note: Expenditures for computer software used to support library operations or to link to external networks, including the Internet, are reported under Other Expenditures.

8.10 Total: Collection Expenditures (All) (Calculated)*

This is the calculated total of all collection expenditures.

8.11 Other Expenditures (Electronic Access)

Report all operating expenditures from the library budget associated with access to electronic materials and services. Include computer hardware and software used to support library operations, whether purchased or leased, mainframe and microcomputer. Include expenditures for maintenance. Include expenditures for equipment used to run information service products when that expenditure can be separated from the price of the product. Report expenditures for services provided by national, regional, and local bibliographic utilities, networks, consortia and commercial services. Report all fees and

usage costs associated with such services as OCLC FirstSearch or electronic document delivery. Note: These expenditures should also be included in Total: Operating Expenditures. *If these expenditures are not currently kept separately by your library, please enter 0 here, and lump these costs into question 8.12 below.*

8.12 Other Expenditures

Include all expenditures other than those given previously.

Note: Include expenses such as binding, supplies, repair, or replacement of existing furnishings and equipment; and costs of computer hardware and software used to support library operations or to link to external networks, including the Internet. Report contracts for services, such as costs of operating and maintaining physical facilities, and fees paid to a consultant, auditor, architect, attorney, etc.

8.13 Total: Other Expenditures (Calculated)*

This is the calculated value of the “other” expenditures.

8.14 Total: Operating Expenditures (Calculated)*

This is the calculated value for all operating expenditures.

8.15 Total: Capital Expenditures*

Report major capital expenditures (the acquisition of or additions to fixed assets). Examples include expenditures for (a) site acquisitions; (b) new buildings; (c) additions to or renovation of library buildings; (d) furnishings, equipment, and initial book stock for new buildings, building additions, or building renovations; (e) library automation systems; (f) new vehicles; and (g) other one-time major projects. Include federal, state, local, or other revenue used for major capital expenditures. Only funds that are supported by expenditure documents (e.g., invoices, contracts, payroll records, etc.) at the point of disbursement should be included. Estimated costs are not included. Exclude expenditures for replacement and repair of existing furnishings and equipment, regular purchase of library materials, and investments for capital appreciation. Exclude contributions to endowments, or revenue passed through to another agency (e.g., fines). Funds transferred from one public library to another public library should be reported by only one of the public libraries.

SECTION 9: ELECTRONIC ACCESS AND INFORMATION

9.01 ILS Vendor

Please list your ILS vendor, if applicable.

9.02 Number of Online Catalog Searches

Total number of searches made to the library’s online catalog, either in the library or remotely.

9.03 Number of Visits to the Library’s Website

Visits represent the number of individual sessions initiated by all visitors to your site. A visit/session ends when someone closes their browser or stops loading webpages on the website for a period of time (typically when more than 30 minutes elapses between page views, but this is arbitrary).

A visit is usually determined by each user’s unique IP address, and/or their login account name when they are accessing secure parts of the website. The details for website visits/sessions are contained within the access log file for the web server(s) and may be accessible using log file analysis or web analytics reporting tools.

Virtual visits include a user’s request of the library website or catalog from outside the library. A single visit to a website may involve loading of numerous webpages or gratuitous elements (images, style sheets, etc.).

LICENSED DATABASES

Report the number of licensed databases (including locally mounted or remote, full-text or not) for which temporary or permanent access rights have been acquired through payment by the library (directly or through a cooperative agreement within the state or region), or acquired by formal agreement with the State library. A database is a collection of electronically stored data or unit records (facts, bibliographic data, abstracts, texts) with a common user interface and software for the retrieval and manipulation of the data.

Note: The data or records are usually collected with a particular intent and relate to a defined topic. A database may be issued on CD-ROM, diskette, or other direct access method, or as a computer file accessed via dial-up methods or via the Internet. Subscriptions to individual electronic serial titles are reported under Current Electronic Serial Subscriptions. Each database is counted individually even if access to several databases is supported through the same vendor interface.

Report the number of licensed databases acquired through payment or formal agreement, by source of access:

9.04 Databases: Local/Other Cooperative Agreements*

This is the total number of databases made available based on the constraints listed above.

9.05 Databases: State (State Supplied)*

This is the number of databases the State Library supplies.

9.06 Total Electronic Collections (Calculated)*

This is the sum of Local/Other cooperative agreements, and State electronic collections.

An electronic collection is a collection of electronically stored data or unit records (facts, bibliographic data, abstracts, texts, photographs, music, video, etc.) with a common user interface and software for the retrieval and use of the data. An electronic collection may be organized, curated and electronically shared by the library, or rights may be provided by a third party vendor. An electronic collection may be funded by the library, or provided through cooperative agreement with other libraries, or through the State Library. Do not include electronic collections that are provided by third parties and freely linked to on the web.

Electronic Collections do not have a circulation period, and may be retained by the patron. Remote access to the collection may or may not require authentication. Unit records may or may not be included in the library's catalog; the library may or may not select individual titles. Include electronic collections that are available online or are locally hosted in the library.

SECTION 9A: DOWNLOADABLE E-BOOKS

E-books are digital documents (including those digitized by the library), licensed or not, where searchable text is prevalent, and which can be seen in analogy to a printed book (monograph). E-books are loaned to users on portable devices (e-book readers) or by transmitting the contents to the user's personal computer for a limited time. Include e-books held locally and remote e-books for which permanent or temporary access rights have been acquired. Report the number of electronic units, including duplicates, at the administrative entity level; do not duplicate unit count for each branch. E-books packaged together as a unit (e.g., multiple titles on a single ebook reader) and checked out as a unit are counted as one unit.

Vendor – List the vendor.

Consortium – Indicate whether the purchase is part of a consortial or collaborative purchase.

Units* -- Report the number of units. Report only items that have been purchased, leased or licensed by the library, a consortium, the state library, a donor or other person or entity. Included items must only be accessible with a valid library card or at a physical library location; inclusion in the catalog is not required. Do not include items freely available without monetary exchange. Do not include items that are permanently retained by the patron; count only items that have a set circulation period where it is available for their use. Count electronic materials at the administrative entity level; do not duplicate numbers at each branch.

NOTE: For purposes of this survey, units are defined as “units of acquisition or purchase”. The “unit” is determined by considering whether the item is restricted to a finite number of simultaneous users or an unlimited number of simultaneous users.

Finite simultaneous use: units of acquisition or purchase is based on the number of simultaneous usages acquired (equivalent to purchasing multiple copies of a single title). For example, if a library acquires a title with rights to a single user at a time, then that item is counted as 1 “unit”; if the library acquires rights to a single title for 10 simultaneous users, then that item is counted as 10 “units”. For smaller libraries, if volume data are not available, the number of titles may be counted.

SECTION 9B: DOWNLOADABLE AUDIO BOOKS

AND

SECTION 9C: DOWNLOADABLE MUSIC

These are downloadable electronic files on which sounds (only) are stored (recorded) and that can be reproduced (played back) electronically. Audio – Downloadable Units may be loaned to users on portable devices or by transmitting the contents to the user’s personal computer for a limited time. Include Audio – Downloadable Units held locally and remote Audio – Downloadable Units for which permanent or temporary access rights have been acquired.

Vendor – List the vendor.

Consortium – Indicate whether the purchase is part of a consortial or collaborative purchase.

Units* -- Report the number of units. Report only items that have been purchased, leased or licensed by the library, a consortium, the state library, a donor or other person or entity. Included items must only be accessible with a valid library card or at a physical library location; inclusion in the catalog is not required. Do not include items freely available without monetary exchange. Do not include items that are permanently retained by the patron; count only items that have a set circulation period where it is available for their use. Count electronic materials at the administrative entity level; do not duplicate numbers at each branch.

NOTE: For purposes of this survey, units are defined as “units of acquisition or purchase”. The “unit” is determined by considering whether the item is restricted to a finite number of simultaneous users or an unlimited number of simultaneous users.

Finite simultaneous use: units of acquisition or purchase is based on the number of simultaneous usages acquired (equivalent to purchasing multiple copies of a single title). SECTION 9D: DOWNLOADABLE VIDEO

These are downloadable electronic files on which moving pictures are recorded, with or without sound. Electronic playback reproduces pictures, with or without sound, using a television receiver, computer monitor or video-enabled mobile device. Video – Downloadable Units may be loaned to users on portable devices or by transmitting the contents to the user’s personal computer for a limited time. Include Video – Downloadable Units held locally and remote Video – Downloadable Units for which permanent or temporary access rights have been acquired.

Vendor – List the vendor.

Consortium – Indicate whether the purchase is part of a consortial or collaborative purchase.

Units* -- Report the number of units. Report only items that have been purchased, leased or licensed by the library, a consortium, the state library, a donor or other person or entity. Included items must only be accessible with a valid library card or at a physical library location; inclusion in the catalog is not required. Do not include items freely available without monetary exchange. Do not include items that are permanently retained by the patron; count only items that have a set circulation period where it is available for their use. Count electronic materials at the administrative entity level; do not duplicate numbers at each branch.

NOTE: For purposes of this survey, units are defined as “units of acquisition or purchase”. The “unit” is determined by considering whether the item is restricted to a finite number of simultaneous users or an unlimited number of simultaneous users.

Finite simultaneous use: units of acquisition or purchase is based on the number of simultaneous usages acquired (equivalent to purchasing multiple copies of a single title). SECTION 10A: OUTLET INFORMATION

This section asks for outlet (building or bookmobile) information on library materials and services.

If your library is a single outlet (has only one building and no bookmobile), you will complete one outlet record for the library.

If your library has multiple facilities, complete an outlet record for each central, branch, bookmobile and direct mail service. If your library has a separate administrative office that has collections or services to the public, be sure to complete an outlet record for the administrative office. If the administrative office does not have collections or services to the public, you don’t need to complete an additional outlet record.

IDENTIFICATION

10A.01 FSCS ID (IMLS Assigned)*

This is the identification code assigned by IMLS. Outlets are assigned the same FSCS ID as the administrative entity to which they belong, with a unique three-digit suffix added to distinguish each outlet.

10A.02 LIB ID (State Assigned)*

This is the state-assigned identification code for the outlet. Libraries may not edit this.

10A.03 Library Name*

This is the legal name of the outlet.

Note: Provide the legal name of the outlet. Do not use acronyms. Do not abbreviate the name unless it exceeds the WebPLUS field length of 60 characters. Avoid abbreviations at the beginning of the name and do not punctuate abbreviations.

10A.04 Main Number*

This is the telephone number of the outlet, including area code. Note: Report telephone number without spacing or punctuation. If the outlet has no phone, check “-3” (for “Not Applicable”).

ADDRESS

10A.05 Street Address*

This is the complete street address of the outlet.

Note: Do not report a post office box or general delivery. For a bookmobile that operates from an administrative entity, branch, or central library, report the address of the administrative entity, branch or central library from which it operates. For a bookmobile that is itself the administrative entity, report the address where the bookmobile is parked at night.

10A.06 City*

This is the city or town in which the outlet is located.

10A.07 ZIP Code*

This is the standard five-digit postal ZIP code for the street address of the outlet.

10A.08 County*

This is the county in which the outlet is physically located.

CLASSIFICATION AND STRUCTURE

10A.09 Outlet Type Code*

An outlet is a unit of an administrative entity that provides direct public library service. Select one of the following:

- BM – Books-by-Mail Only. A direct mail order service which provides books and other library materials. Books-by-mail typically serves rural residents, the disabled, the homebound, and others without access to another type of public library outlet. Requests for materials are usually received by mail and by telephone only. Only books-by-mail services that are housed separately from any other type of direct public service outlet (that is, central library, branches, or bookmobiles) should be coded here.
- BR – Branch Library. A branch library is an auxiliary unit of an administrative entity which as at least all of the following:
 - ✓ Separate quarters;
 - ✓ An organized collection of library materials;
 - ✓ Paid staff; and
 - ✓ Regularly scheduled hours for being open to the public.
- BS – Bookmobile(s). A bookmobile is a traveling branch library. It consists of at least all of the following:
 - ✓ A truck or van that carries an organized collection of library materials;
 - ✓ A paid staff; and
 - ✓ Regularly scheduled hours (bookmobile stops) for being open to the public.

Note: A separate outlet record may be created for each bookmobile. You may wish to create separate outlet records for individual bookmobiles if (1) they have different addresses and/or (2) they have different Metropolitan Status Codes. Alternatively, a bookmobile outlet record may include more than one bookmobile.

- CE – Central Library. This is one type of single outlet library (SO) or the library which is the operational center of a multiple-outlet library (MO or MA). Usually all processing is centralized here and the principal collections are housed here. Synonymous with main library.

Note: Each administrative entity may report either no central library or one central library. No administrative entity may report more than one central library. If you wish to identify a central library in the outlet file, identify the library with the largest collection as the central library for FSCS purposes, and report all others as branches. Where there are several co-equal outlets and no principal collection, report all such outlets as branches, not central libraries.

10A.10 Square Footage of Outlet*

Provide the area, in square feet, of the public library outlet (central library or branch). Report the total area in square feet for each library outlet (central library or branch) separately. This is the area on all floors enclosed by the outer walls of the library outlet. Include all areas occupied by the library outlet, including those areas off-limits to the public. Include any areas shared with another agency or agencies if the outlet has use of that area.

10A.11 Number of Bookmobiles in the Bookmobile Outlet Record*

The number of bookmobiles in the bookmobile outlet record.

Note: A bookmobile outlet record may include one or more bookmobiles. Complete this data element only if the outlet record is of the type BS – Bookmobile(s). A bookmobile is a traveling branch library. It consists of at least all of the following:

- ✓ A truck or van that carries an organized collection of library materials;
- ✓ A paid staff; and
- ✓ Regularly scheduled hours (bookmobile stops) for being open to the public. County vehicles in use, not the number of stops the vehicle makes.

10A.12 Type of Internet Connectivity

Enter a description of your library's type of connection:

- DSL

10A.13 Maximum Speed of Connection

Enter your library's connection speed:

10A.14 Wireless Internet Access

Please indicate whether this outlet offers wireless access to the Internet.

10A.15 Wireless Sessions – Annually*

Report the number of wireless sessions provided by the library wireless service annually.

SECTION 10B: OUTLET DATA

This section of the survey collects data on selected types of materials. It does not cover all materials (i.e., microform, scores, maps, and pictures) for which expenditures are reported elsewhere. Under this category report only items the library has acquired as part of the collection, whether purchased, leased, licensed, or donated as gifts.

COLLECTION INFORMATION

10B.01 Print*

Report a single figure that includes: Books in print. Books are non-serial printed publications (including music and maps) that are bound in hard or soft covers, or in loose-leaf format. Include non-serial government documents. Report the number of physical units, including duplicates. For small libraries, if volume data are not available, count the number of titles. Books packaged together as a unit (e.g., a 2-volume set) and checked out as a unit are counted as one physical unit.

10B.02 Physical Audio*

These are materials circulated in a fixed, physical format on which sounds (only) are stored (recorded) and that can be reproduced (played back) mechanically, electronically, or both. Include records, audiocassettes, audio cartridges, audio discs (include audio CD-ROMs), audio-reels, talking books, and other sound recordings stored in a fixed, physical format. Do not include downloadable electronic audio files.

Report the number of units, including duplicates. Items packaged together as a unit (e.g. two audiocassettes for one recorded book) and checked out as a unit are counted as one physical unit.

10B.03 Physical Video*

These are materials circulated in a fixed, physical format on which moving pictures are recorded, with or without sound. Electronic playback reproduces pictures, with or without sound, using a television receiver or computer monitor. Video formats may include tape, DVD and CD-ROM. Do not include downloadable electronic video files.

Report the number of units, including duplicates. Items packaged together as a unit (e.g. two DVDs for one movie) and checked out as a unit are counted as one physical unit.

10B.04 Children's Print

This includes all materials for the ages of 0-11, consisting primarily of words and usually produced by making an impression with ink on paper. Included in this category are materials that did not require magnification: books, bound periodicals, government documents, Braille material, ephemeral material, and the like. Exclude current serial subscriptions and microforms.

10B.05 Other Children's Materials

All materials for ages 0-11 in any other format, for example: current serial subscriptions, microforms, machine readable materials, audiovisual materials and all other categories.

EXPENDITURES AND SUBSCRIPTIONS

10B.06 Expenditures (Children's Print)

These are expenditures for all materials for the ages 0-11, consisting primarily of words and usually produced by making an impression with ink or paper. Included in this category are materials that did not require magnification: books, bound periodicals, government documents, Braille material, ephemeral print materials, and the like. Exclude current serial subscriptions and microforms.

10B.07 Expenditures (Other Children's)

Expenditures for all materials for ages 0-11 in any other format, for example: current serial subscriptions, microforms, machine readable materials, audiovisual material and all other categories.

10B.08 Current Print Serial Subscriptions*

Current serial subscriptions are arrangements by which, in return for a sum paid in advance, serials are provided for a specific number of issues. Include current serial subscriptions in print, electronic, and digital formats.

Report the number of current print serial subscriptions, including duplicates, for all outlets. Examples of serials are periodicals (magazines), newspapers, annuals, some government documents, some reference tools, and numbered monographic series.

LIBRARY AVAILABILITY

10B.09 Public Service Hours per Year*

This is the number of annual public service hours for outlets (reported individually by central, branch, bookmobile and Books-by-Mail Only).

Note: Include the actual hours open for public service for centrals, branches, and bookmobiles, and Books-by-Mail Only. For each bookmobile, count only the hours during which the bookmobile is open to the public. For administrative entities that offer ONLY books-by-mail service, count the hours that the outlet is staffed for service. Minor variations in public service hours need not be included. Extensive hours closed to the public due to natural disasters or other events should be excluded from the count.

10B.10 Number of Weeks a Library is Open*

This is the number of weeks during the year that an outlet was open to the public.

Note: Include the number of weeks open for public service for centrals, branches, bookmobiles, and Books-by-Mail Only. For each bookmobile, count only the weeks during which the bookmobile is open to the public. For administrative entities that offer ONLY books-by-mail service, count the weeks that the outlet is staffed for service. The count should be based on the number of weeks that a library outlet was open for half or more of its scheduled service hours. Extensive weeks closed to the public due to natural disasters or other events should be excluded from the count. Do not calculate based on total number of service hours per year at the outlet level. For example, by dividing total hours by 52 (weeks), round to the nearest whole number of weeks. If the library was open half or more of its scheduled hours in a given week, round up to the next week. If the library was open less than half of its scheduled hours, round down.

10B.11 Library Visits per Year*

This is the total number of persons entering the library for whatever purpose during the year.

Note: If an actual count of visits is unavailable, determine an annual estimate by counting visits during a typical week in October and multiplying the count by 52. A "typical week" is a time that is neither unusually busy nor unusually slow. Avoid holiday times, vacation periods for key staff, or days when unusual events are taking place in the community or the library. Choose a week in which the library is open its regular hours. Include seven consecutive calendar days, from Sunday through Saturday (or whenever the library is actually open).

REFERENCE AND CIRCULATION TRANSACTIONS

10B.12 Reference Transactions*

Reference Transactions are information consultations in which library staff recommend, interpret, evaluate, and/or use information resources to help others to meet particular information needs.

A reference transaction includes information and referral service as well as unscheduled individual instruction and assistance in using information sources (including web sites and computer-assisted instruction). Count Readers Advisory questions as reference transactions.

Information sources include (a) printed and non-printed material; (b) machine-readable databases (including computer-assisted instruction); (c) the library's own catalogs and other holdings records; (d) other libraries and institutions through communication or referral; and (e) persons both inside and outside the library.

When a staff member uses information gained from previous use of information sources to answer a question, the transaction is reported as a reference transaction even if the source is not consulted again.

If a contact includes both reference and directional services, it should be reported as one reference transaction. Duration should not be an element in determining whether a transaction is a reference transaction.

Note: It is essential that libraries do not include directional transactions in the report of reference transactions. Directional transactions include giving instruction for locating staff, library users, or physical features within the library. Examples of directional transactions include, "Where is the reference librarian? Where is Susan Smith? Where is the rest room? Where are the 600s? Can you help me make a photocopy?"

If an annual count of reference transactions is unavailable, count reference transactions during a typical week or weeks, and multiply the count to represent an annual estimate. [If the sample is done four times a year, multiply totals by 13, if done twice a year multiply by 26, if done only annually, multiply by 52.] A "typical week" is a time that is neither unusually busy nor unusually slow. Avoid holiday times, vacation periods for key staff, or days when unusual events are taking place in the community or in the library. Choose a week in which the library is open its regular hours.

10B.13 Circulation Transactions (Physical)*

The total annual circulation of all physical library materials of all types, including renewals.

Note: Count all physical materials in all formats that are charged out for use outside the library. Interlibrary loan transactions included are only items borrowed for users. Do not include items checked out to another library.

10B.14 Circulation Transactions (Children's Materials)*

This is the total annual circulation of all children's materials in all formats to all users, including renewals.

LIBRARY PROGRAMS

A program is any planned event which introduces the group attending to any of the broad range of library services or activities or which directly provides information to participants. Programs may cover use of the library, library services, or library tours. Programs may also provide cultural, recreational, or educational information, often designed to meet a specific social need. Examples of these types of programs include film showings, lectures, story hours, literacy, English as a second language, citizenship classes, and book discussions.

Count all programs, whether held on or off-site, that are sponsored by or co-sponsored by the library. Exclude programs sponsored by other groups that use library facilities.

If programs are offered as a series, count each program in the series. For example, a film series offered once a week for eight weeks should be counted as eight programs.

Note: Exclude library activities delivered on a one-to-one basis, rather than to a group, such as a one-to-one literacy tutoring, services to homebound, resume writing assistance, homework assistance, and mentoring activities.

10B.15 Library Programs for Children (0-11)*

This is the number of programs held for young adults between the ages of 0-11.

A children's program is any planned event for which the primary audience is children and which introduces the group of children attending to any of the broad range of library services or activities for children or which directly provides information to participants. Children's programs may cover use of the library, library services, or library tours. Children's programs may also provide cultural, recreational, or educational information, often designed to meet a specific social need. Examples of these types of programs include story hours and summer reading events.

Count all children's programs, whether held on or off-site, that are sponsored or co-sponsored by the library. Do not include children's programs sponsored by other groups that use library facilities. If children's programs are offered as a

series, count each program in the series. For example, a story hour offered once a week, 48 weeks a year, should be counted as 48 programs. Exclude library activities for children delivered on a one-to-one basis, rather than to a group, such as one-to-one literacy tutoring, services to homebound, homework assistance, and mentoring activities.

10B.16 Library Programs for Young Adults (12-18)*

This is the number of programs held for young adults between the ages of 12-18.

A young adult program is any planned event for which the primary audience is young adult and which introduces the group of young adults attending to any of the broad range of library services or activities for young adults or which directly provides information to participants. Young adult programs may cover use of the library, library services, or library tours. Young adult programs may also provide cultural, recreational, or educational information, often designed to meet a specific social need. Examples of these types of programs include book clubs and summer reading events.

Count all young adult programs, whether held on or off-site, that are sponsored or co-sponsored by the library. Do not include young adult programs sponsored by other groups that use library facilities. If young adult programs are offered as a series, count each program in the series. For example, a book club offered every two weeks, 24 weeks a year, should be counted as 24 programs. Exclude library activities for young adults delivered on a one-to-one basis, rather than to a group, such as one-to-one literacy tutoring, services to homebound, homework assistance, and mentoring activities. This figure is a subset of the Total Number of Library Programs.

10B.17 Library Programs for Adults (19 and Up)

This is the number of programs held for adults ages 19 and up.

10B.18 Total: Library Programs (Calculated)*

This is the calculated total for all programs entered.

10B.19 Story Time Programs for Children

This is the number of story time programs held for children, primarily between the ages of 0-5. Count multi-age and family story times, if they are appropriate for children ages 0-5.

LIBRARY PROGRAM ATTENDANCE

10B.20 Children's Program Attendance (0-11)*

This is the number of people in attendance at programming for young adults ages 0-11.

This number is not automatically calculated, so you may enter a number here even if you have entered one for the two questions above.

The count of the audience at all programs for which the primary audience is children 11 years and under. Include adults who attend programs intended primarily for children.

Note: Do not count attendance at library activities for children that are delivered on a one-to-one basis, rather than to a group, such as one-to-one literacy tutoring, services to homebound, homework assistance, and mentoring activities.

10B.21 Young Adults Program Attendance (12-18)*

This is the number of people in attendance at programming for young adults ages 12-18.

The count of the audience at all programs for which the primary audience is young adults aged 12 to 18 years and includes 18 year olds. Include adults* who attend programs intended primarily for young adults.

Note: Do not count attendance at library activities for young adults that are delivered on a one-to-one basis, rather than to a group, such as one-to-one literacy tutoring, services to homebound, homework assistance, and mentoring activities.

*Please count all patrons that attend the young adult programs regardless of age.

10B.22 Adult Program Attendance (19 and Up)

This is the count of the audience at all programs for which the primary audience is adults. Include young adults and children who attend the programs intended primarily for adults.

10B.23 Total: Library Programs Attendance (Calculated)*

This is the calculated value for all program attendance entered.

10B.24 Story Time Programs for Children Attendance

This is the number of attendees at story time programs held for children, primarily between the ages of 0-5. Count attendance at multi-age and family story times, if they are appropriate for children ages 0-5. Include all attendees regardless of age.

COMPUTER INFORMATION

10B.25 Number of Internet Computers Used by General Public*

Report the number of the library's Internet computers [personal computers (PCs) and laptops], whether purchased, leased, or donated, used by the general public in the library.

10B.26 Uses (Sessions) of Public Internet Computers per Year*

Report the total number of uses (sessions) of the library's Internet computers in the library during the last year. If the computer is used for multiple purposes (Internet access, word-processing, OPAC, etc.) and Internet uses (sessions) cannot be isolated, report all usage. A typical week or other reliable estimate may be used to determine the annual number. Sign-up forms or Web-log tracking software also may provide a reliable count of uses (sessions).

Note: The number of uses (sessions) may be counted manually, using registration logs. Count each use (session) for public internet computers, regardless of the amount of time spent on the computer. A use (session) on the library's public internet computer(s) three times a year would count as three uses (sessions). Software such as "Historian" can also be used to track the number of uses (sessions) at each public internet computer. If the data element is collected as a weekly figure, multiply that figure by 52 to annualize it.

Reminder: This count includes only the library's Internet computers. Do NOT include Wi-Fi access using non-library computers.

SECTION 10C: OUTLET DATA (TOTAL)

This section allows you to check that you have entered all outlet data for collections and programs, and that it adds up to your library system total. You cannot edit these measures here; you must go back to the outlet records and correct them there. If there are edit checks, you will be prompted to respond here after you hit Verify or Final Submittal.
