

SGIA Construction Grants 2016

Ak-Chin Indian Community Library **\$17,542**

The Ak-Chin Community Library will use SGIAC funds to support STEAM programming in the library. The library will create a Makerspace and Green Room. Both new spaces will help youth learn technology skills and enhance their abilities to express themselves creatively. The Green room will allow patrons to develop video projects and also serve the popular Movie Club Program.

Buckeye Public Library-Downtown Library **\$11,812**

The Buckeye Public Library-Downtown Branch will use SGIAC funds to alter the parking lot, restrooms, and entrance of the library to ensure ADA compliance.

Coolidge Public Library **\$36,150**

Coolidge Public Library will use SGIAC funds to enclose their outdoor patio and convert it into a programming room. The library currently has no dedicated programming room and the enclosed patio will help accommodate recent population growth in the city.

Parker Public Library **\$6,000**

Parker Public Library will use SGIAC funds to purchase a prefabricated building as an addition to their current library facilities. This space will be used as a programming area, for book sales, and for community meetings.

Pinetop-Lakeside Library **\$9,000**

Pinetop-Lakeside Library will use SGIAC funds to install synchronized automatic door openers on the main entrance to their library. This will increase accessibility to the library and ensure ADA compliance. Funds will also be used to repair and re-stain exterior library siding, which is deteriorating and at risk of falling and causing injuries to people walking near the library.

Tolleson Public Library **\$40,896**

Tolleson Public Library will use SGIAC funds to enclose an outdoor courtyard area and convert it into a meeting room. Tolleson Public Library currently has no separate meeting space. The new space will be especially needed as Tolleson is seeking to become an Arizona Read On Community and will need the space for early literacy programming. The library has tripled their programming attendance during the past year, and the new space will increase meeting capacity to 71 people.
